Residence Hall Rooms

Rooms are furnished for one student; each having a bed, a dresser, a desk, and a chair. This furniture **may not** be removed from the room. Rooms are also equipped with mini-blinds. Anything used in decorating should not deface the room in any way.

Most of our students will be assigned a private room unless roommates mutually request one another.

Student Apartments

Upperclassmen (upperclassman status is 21 years of age or completion of 60 credit hours) may choose to live in the campus apartments. Each apartment has 4 single occupancy bedrooms, 2 baths, and a shared kitchen and living room area. Each bedroom has its own phone number. The bedroom window size and floor dimensions vary.

The student apartments are fully furnished; however, students may wish to bring some small items to personalize their living space. Bean bag chairs are allowed, while recliners and couches are not. Students may bring lamps, storage containers and decorations as long as they can be moved into the apartment without potential for causing damage to the building. Only one microwave is allowed per apartment; personal fridges are not allowed in the apartments.

General Information

- Laundry facilities and change machines are available in each residence hall.
- The college has both regular and extra long twin mattresses. It is suggested that you buy extra long sheets so that they will fit either.
- Cable and internet access are available in each room. The college reserves the right to block channels that may be inappropriate. See the Computer Usage Policy in the Student Handbook for further details and PantherNet registration and usage requirements.
- Your friends and relatives are always welcome at York College. Please refer to the Student Handbook for guidelines regarding guests and visitation.

Dress Code

While in the lobby areas of the residence halls you are expected to observe the college dress code as stated in the Student Handbook. You are also to be dressed decently in other areas of the residence hall during business hours. Clothing with inappropriate advertising, pictures and/or sayings that are contrary to the mission and Christian standards of York College is prohibited. This includes clothing with suggestive language/pictures or clothing that advertises alcohol or tobacco products.

Please Do Not Bring:

Items that pose safety hazards, such as: Candles with wicks, incense, matches, lighters or lighter fluid, fireworks, extension cords, weapons, paintball guns, pellet guns, firearms or ammunition, unshielded halogen bulbs, open element appliances, such as space heaters, toasters, etc.

Items prohibited at York College, such as: Alcoholic beverages, tobacco, or items advertising either of these, highway signs, sexually exploitative posters or materials, etc.

Items that may damage the room if used or installed, such as: Duct tape, carpet tape, nails, screws, any wall fasteners, any extension cords or power strips not provided by the college, window air conditioning units, TV satellite dishes, ceiling fans, etc.
